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Imām Abū Bakr Muḥammad ibn al-Ḥusayn al-Ājūrī was a famous muḥaddith and jurist from the fourth century after Hegira. He was born and grew up in the western part of Baghdād named Darb al-'Ajūrr, hence the appellation. Ibn Khallikān says: 'He was a Shāfi'ī jurist and a muḥaddith; he is the author of the famous book *Al-Arba'īn*. He was a righteous and a pious man.' Dhahabī says about him: 'The Imām, the muhaddith; he was the Imām of the grand mosque in Makkah (*Imām al-Ḥaram*); a truthful, charitable and a pious man; a man of exemplary character.'
